


The goal of the consultation program is to help small employers in high hazard industries recognize and correct safety and health hazards in their facilities.

These services offer employers the opportunity to learn how to maintain a safe and healthy workplace through the development and implementation of proven, effective safety and health programs. Assistance and training are provided by qualified professionals experienced in a variety of safety and health issues facing today's industries.

The Consultation Section offers consultative surveys *at no cost to the employer*. These surveys not only serve to help maintain compliance with OSHA standards, but also address potential problems that may lead to work-related illness or injury and provide suggestions and instruction on the correction of any hazards found.

Consultants will not:

- Issue citations or monetary penalties for violations; OR
- Guarantee that any workplace will "pass" a federal OSHA inspection.

What We Provide

A comprehensive consultation service includes the following:
