

Identifying and eliminating FOCUS FOUR hazards on construction worksites



Hazard occurs when anything that could cause a worker to lose balance and result in a fall.



Hazard occurs upon contact of a body part with any source of electricity that causes a flow of current through the skin, muscles, or hair.



Hazard occurs when a person becomes caught, squeezed, crushed, pinched, or compressed between two or more objects or parts of an object.



Hazard occurs when an object or piece of equipment injures a worker by contact or by impact.





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OSHA Consultation Section



During a calendar year, the same award cannot be received twice. Should a company satisfy the required guidelines for an additional award, that award can be received in a different calendar year.



This award will be given

to the **construction company** that accumulates 1,000,000 or more hours worked, by combining all worksites and office staff for all calendar years. The company must not have a lost day away from work, due to a job related injury or illness and cannot have received an OSHA citation.



This award will be given

to any **construction company** that works six months or longer at one jobsite or at a different jobsite, with a different a crew, and without a two week break between jobs. There must not be a lost day away from work due to a job-related injury or illness. The company must not have received an OSHA citation.



that works at one jobsite for at least two years without having a lost day away from work, due to a job related injury or illness. The contractor cannot have received an OSHA citation, within this time period.



a **subcontractor** that works at one or multiple jobsites for at least three months without two weeks between jobs. There must not have been a lost day away from work, due to a job related injury or illness and the subcontractor must not have received an OSHA citation.



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
