<u>ORDER</u>

The respondents move to dismiss the claimant's appeal to the

Arkansas Court of Appeals. The Full Commission denies the motion.

An administrative law judge filed an opinion on December 21, 2021.

limitations barred the claim. The Full Commission unanimously affirmed

and adopted the administrative law judge's decision in an opinion filed May

24, 2022. The claimant subsequently filed a notice of appeal to the

Arkansas Court of Appeals.

Rule 3(b), the Commission may dismiss an appeal to the Court of Appeals only if the motion to dismiss is filed with the Commission before the record on appeal is filed with the Court, and if all parties to the appeal petition by a joint stipulation that the appeal is to be dismissed. *In Re Arkansas Rules of Appellate Procedure 3(b)*; 296 Ark. 580, 756 S.W.2d LXXV (1988).

In the present matter, the parties have not petitioned by a joint stipulation that the appeal is to be dismissed. The Full Commission therefore denies the respondents' motion.
