STATEMENT OF THE CASE

A hearing was held in the above-styled matter on June 15, 2022, in Mountain Home, Arkansas, on respondent's Motion to Dismiss for failure to prosecute pursuant to Ark. Code Ann. §11-9-702 and Rule 099.13 of the Arkansas Workers' Compensation Act. The claimant contended that he was injured on April 7, 2020, when he fell from a grader tire that he was standing on, which resulted in the claimant contending that he was knocked out. He filed an AR-C on September 16, 2020. The respondents filed a Form 2 on September 25, 2020, denying the claim. The claimant has not sought any type of *bona fide* hearing before the Workers' Compensation Commission in the last six (6) months.

A hearing was set for June 15, 2022, in regard to the Motion to Dismiss and the claimant failed to appear after appropriate notice. At the time of the hearing, Mr. Jason M. Ryburn appeared on behalf of the respondents and asked that the matter be dismissed for lack of prosecution.
