
June 8, 2017

A specially scheduled meeting of the Arkansas Motor Vehicle Commission began at 9:30 a.m. in the Governor's Conference Room at the Arkansas State Capitol. The purpose of this meeting was to present the grant checks to the recipients of the Education and Training and Grant Program. Staff present included Kristi Byers, Gordon McCoy, Crystal Campbell, and Tanelle Hymes. All Commissioners were present during the meeting with the exception of Mitchell Ward, John Sahene, Gary Futrell, and Foster Davis, all with excused absences. Also in attendance were Dennis Jungmeyer with AADA, Governor Hutchinson, a number of members of the Governor's staff, and all twelve recipients of the grant funds.

The following institutions received grants: Northwest Technical Institute, Cabot High School, Pulaski Technical College, Gentry High School Conversion Charter GHSCC, Pine Bluff High School, Ouachita Career Center, University of Arkansas at Fort Smith, ASU-Beebe/Searcy Campus, Don Tyson School of Innovation each awarded \$15,136.11 and Waldron High School, awarded \$13,775.00.

Following the grant presentation in the Governor's Conference Room, the recipients, Commissioners, and Commission staff held a reception honoring these awardees as the inaugural grant class in the Victory Building. Commission Chairman Joy Blankenship and Kristi Byers made brief remarks to the recipients about the program.
