Claimant is pro se and failed to appear.

Respondents are represented by their attorney, Karen H. McKinney, Attorney at Law, Little Rock, Arkansas.

STATEMENT OF THE CASE

A hearing was held in the above-styled matter on July 20, 2021, in Little Rock, Arkansas, on Respondents' Second Motion to Dismiss for failure to prosecute pursuant to Ark. Code Ann. § 11-9-702 and Rule 099.13 of the Arkansas Workers' Compensation Act. The claimant was *pro se* and failed to appear for the hearing. The claimant had been previously represented by Steven R. McNeely, who had been allowed to withdraw by an Order of the Full Commission dated April 30, 2021. The claimant was employed by Rock Region Metro and alleged a work-related injury on September 16, 2016, and filed a Form AR-C on or about March 27, 2018. A First Report of Injury was filed on March 29, 2018, which provided that the claimant had suffered an injury to her right shoulder. The First Motion to Dismiss was denied, and a second Motion to Dismiss was filed on May 4, 2021.

An appropriate notice setting this matter for a hearing on the Motion to Dismiss

was provided to the claimant by both certified and regular mail. A hearing was set for

July 20, 2021, in regard to the Motion to Dismiss. The claimant failed to appear on the

hearing date in Little Rock, Arkansas. At the time of the hearing, Karen H. McKinney

appeared on behalf of the respondents and asked that the matter be dismissed for lack

of prosecution.

After a review of the record as a whole, to include all evidence properly before the

Commission, and having had an opportunity to hear the statements of the attorney for the

respondents, I find that this matter should be dismissed for failure to prosecute pursuant

to Ark. Code Ann. § 11-9-702 and Rule 099.13 of the Arkansas Workers' Compensation

Act.

<u>ORDER</u>

Pursuant to the above statement of the case, there is no alternative but to dismiss

this claim in its entirety, without prejudice, for failure to prosecute.
