FINDINGS OF FACT, CONCLUSIONS OF LAW AND ORDER

On November 17, 2004, the Arkansas Motor Vehicle Commission (hereinafter referred to as the "Commission") held a hearing in regard to the above-styled matter. The Commission was represented by Assistant Attorney General Larry Crane. The Scooter Superstore appeared by its owner, Mr. Don Carter. After hearing sworn testimony and reviewing documents received into evidence, the Commission made the following findings of fact, conclusions of law and order.

FINDINGS OF FACT

- F1. That from on or about February 16, 2004, through August 24, 2004, The Scooter Superstore purchased motor vehicles from Freedom Imports, Inc. which was not licensed to do business as a distributor of motor vehicles in the State of Arkansas.
- F2. The Scooter Superstore was holding out to the public as offering for sale and was selling motor vehicles produced by Freedom Imports, Inc. at a time when it was not licensed to sell motor vehicles manufactured by Freedom Imports, Inc.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Based on the foregoing Findings of Fact the Commission concludes that the Scooter Superstore has violated A.C.A. § 23-112-308(a)(1)(A),

selling or soliciting sales of a motor vehicle without a license issued by the Commission.

ORDER

- 1. Respondent is ordered to pay a civil penalty in the amount of \$500.00.
- 2. The Scooter Superstore will be authorized to sell Freedom Import, Inc. products beginnings on the date on which Freedom Imports, Inc. is licensed as a distributor in Arkansas.
